That's why we as human beings must reduce as much as we can our plastic use, especially the plastics that are for an only use, for example, food envelope, straws, etc. In my opinion a systemic change is needed in the use and disposal of plastic, and new alternatives in the way it is used in society. There is a need to find a middle ground where the benefits of plastic are realised, without going to the extreme of sacrificing the environment, because at the end of the day the population has the final decision."



Letizia Graziani (Italy) "From the depths of the ocean to the peaks of mountains, plastic has infiltrated every corner of our planet. What was once the cornerstone of modern economies, has now paradoxically become a major contributor to climate change and biodiversity loss, ultimately threatening our life on Earth.

When talking about its disposal, the figures are dramatic: while recycling efforts fall short, with only a fraction of plastic being recycled globally, a big share of it is mismanaged and littered, ultimately leaking into rivers, oceans, and other waterways.

Addressing the root causes of plastic pollution has never been more pressing, with time to reverse the trend shrinking every day and world's population soaring. Public awareness and education play pivotal roles in fostering behavioral change, encouraging responsible consumption, and promoting recycling practices. We need radical changes, a paradigm shift towards a circular economy model, where waste is minimized, and resources are reused and recycled. In this regard, initiatives such as extended producer responsibility, plastic taxes, and investment in innovative recycling technologies are crucial."
